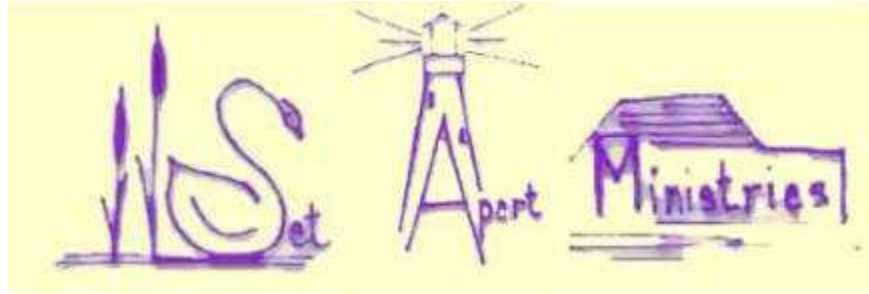

parent or elder stages of maturity?

It **IS** important to understand the maturity levels of your members before they start operating in their spiritual gifts. A person may have the gift of prophecy, for example, but if they are operating at a child level of maturity, the Word will lose its power because of their own flesh getting in the way. Meetings will become battle grounds with people wanting things done their way, arguing and causing disruption and seeking attention.

I have seen the damage of people allowed to be in leadership when they weren't ready. The congregation leaders did not take the maturity of people into consideration. Oftentimes, people were moved into leadership too quickly because of their personalities and/or their willingness to serve. Many problems arose, because these people **DID NOT** have the maturity to administrate and work with other people. This led to chaos, strife, hurt and angry feelings and people leaving the congregation.

I specifically recall one young couple who began attending the church. They were well liked, joined in Bible studies and were baptized. The problems then began. First of all, they **DID NOT** have a sound foundation in the Word. They were then quickly moved into ministry. The young husband, who was very personable, became fully immersed in the life of the church. The young wife began to resent his time in the church. She was disciplined by an older woman with whom she bonded and came to trust. She was handed over to another woman to disciple her because this woman was involved in the same ministry in which the young couple was working. The young wife was unhappy with the change. She was pressed to begin giving a full tithe to the church, which she did not fully understand, because she had not been fully trained in

Is Grace Really Missing in the Old Testament? Can Grace be Misapplied?

Here is where we jump back into our discussion this issue. Is Grace Really Missing in the Old Testament?

Can the Concept of Grace be Misapplied to Avoid Learning YHWH's Commands?

This concern seems to be pulled out whenever someone is concerned about another person falling into legalism; by that they generally mean taking the Old Testament too seriously, or literally. Being ready to address these concerns with factual information is a wonderful way to respond. If someone comes at you with hostility, you can remain calm and direct them to the Word. If someone approaches you with concern for your misunderstanding, you will be equipped to show them exactly why you believe what you believe. Knowing that one is equipped makes it much easier to behave in a gracious manner to any attitude. Again, this is a part of our calling to be mature in every way in our Messiah. By paying attention to our own maturity, not only in Scriptural knowledge but also emotionally, we are able to maintain the quietness and confidence that Isaiah spoke of as our strength.

the Word. She was pushed without allowing the Ruach HaKodesh to convict her to give joyfully.

Sad to say, at this time, this young couple with such hope and enthusiasm have drifted away from *Yeshua*. Their marriage is struggling and they have much anger and hurt with one another and with the church they attended. No one took into consideration that emotionally and spiritually they were "children."

A community CANNOT have "children" leading in the community! This will only lead to strife and chaos.

LEADERS: Do you know your maturity level? Have you taken an honest look at where you stand? We all have weak areas that need work. I encourage you to take time right now to look at the maturity chart located on our website ([click here](#)). When you've filled it out, have someone you trust and know well also evaluate you.

After you've taken the inventory, find a mature person to hold you accountable in your weak areas. Pray and seek *YHWH* for His intervention. Here are but a few examples of grace throughout the Tanakh/Old Testament.

As addressed earlier, legalism is a term not specifically used in Scripture. The concept was a concern for Paul as he addressed the concerns of those coming into Torah observance, but quite different from how the term is used today. If we truly understand the one type of grace as the allowances made for one when in error, unmerited favor, how can we fail to see the many, many evidences of grace in the Old Testament?

- Adam and Eve received grace when they were given coverings for themselves after the fall. Their death occurred on that day of their sin, yes, but within the 1,000 years as we are told a day is as a thousand years to our God.
- Cain was not killed on the spot for his sin of murder, but allowed to live; even when YHWH certainly knew of the rebellion that his generations would bring, ultimately leading to the Flood.
- Moses argued with *Elohim* over whether or not he could speak well enough to accomplish what was asked—and rather than being harmed for his fear, he was given Aaron to help.
- Elijah fought a great battle of faith over the prophets of *Ba'al* and won; yet within hours he was running in fear. . Did he meet with scorn and judgment? No, YHWH provided rest and nourishment for him.
- Judges is nothing but a cycle over and over of *YHWH Elohim's* grace toward his backslidden people. . Ever read how the angel addressed Gideon at first? "Hail mighty warrior!" To one who was hiding in a shed while sifting grain for fear of marauders? Sounds like grace to me to address one in the manner he would grow into, rather than the state he was in at the time!
- David was a murderer and an adulterer, yet he was given grace and called "a man after God's own heart."
- Hannah found grace in the opening of her womb and the birth of Samuel, likewise had Sarah and Rachel found such grace.
- Ruth, a Moabite woman, found so much grace as she honored her mother-in-law and her God, that she became one of Yahshua's ancestors!

Once you get started I am certain you will have no problem finding evidence of our YHWH's grace through the Scriptures, Genesis to Revelation.

CAN THE CONCEPT OF GRACE BE MISUNDERSTOOD AS AN

finished. *YHWH* is continuing to work in us to expose the areas that still need growth.

Recently, during our on-going *Life Model* group, we took a look at the guidelines we had set in place some years ago when we first began the group. It was a blessing to discover some of the guidelines no longer applied or it was not necessary to make a statement because we have grown beyond those stages.

If you are finding strife and constant struggle in your group, take time to step back and look at your own maturity and those in leadership. Not only will you have a stronger fellowship but families will become stronger as parents assume their proper roles. Growing in maturity will give you tools to help the wounded and weak in your group.

In Exodus 18, *Mosheh* selected "able" men to lead over the people. First, he was to teach them in the ways of *Torah* to "show them the way in which they should walk and the work which they do" (Ex. 18:20). When they had a particularly difficult matter, they were to bring the matter to *Mosheh* who spoke directly to *YHWH*.

Here are some specific steps for raising up leaders:

1. Prayerfully select mature people. Examine their fruit over a period of time. What is their maturity level?
2. Train them up in *Torah* and how to apply the teachings of *Torah* in daily life.
3. Continue to oversee their leadership, giving instruction in areas they do not yet understand.
4. Keep your leaders accountable in their maturing process. What are they doing to strengthen their weakness?

EXCUSE FOR NOT LEARNING YHWH'S COMMANDS?

I owe Dietrich Bonhoeffer for the term "cheap grace" which he used to refer to people who basically did whatever they chose and then claimed forgiveness. This misunderstanding of grace can be stated as free license for whatever behavior seems good to an individual. As Paul asked, should we continue in sin because grace abounds? May it never be! (Romans 6:1-2)

Oh yes, grace can surely be mistaught and misapplied. In the desire to be free from the error of rigid interpretation of the letter of the law, people can all too easily run right over the line into the camp of the anti- nomian (anti=against, nomia=Law from the Greek) stance.

Funny, that this term doesn't seem to bother people very much today.

Yet, Yahshua confirmed that not one jot or tittle of the Righteous Teachings (that HE had spoken there on Sinai with the Father) would pass away before heaven and earth pass away. Matthew 5: 17

Of whom are people more afraid? Peers that might call them legalistic if they obey the Righteous Teachings/Torah of YHWH or YHWH Himself if they speak against His Law? Of whom are we instructed to be more afraid: Those who can kill the body but not the soul, or He who judges the heart and Who's Word is a sword piercing to the bone and marrow? We know the answer to that one!

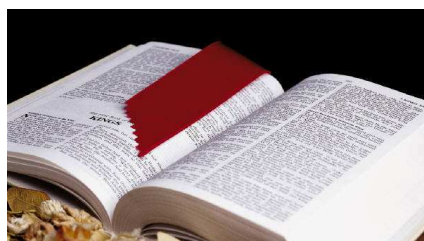
