This same word is used of Abraham, Joshua and David! He is coming again soon, and He is coming to marry a mature Bride, not a small child. May we be found among that number with all the oil our lamps need! At the same time, we are also grateful that He loves all and has already made provision for those who may yet be young in the faith, no matter their chronological age!

Plans for the celebration of *Pesach* Passover are beginning to move ahead now. What a joy that has been, too, as we are seeing more and more of how the feast days are so much the rehearsal for our Bridegroom's appearance. Each year as we learn line upon line, and precept upon precept, we see the picture a little more developed. We will be hosting several days of prayer and fasting and a *mikveh* prior to our *Pesach* meal. How are your plans for this wonderful remembrance coming along? Becoming a Parent Through Spiritual Adoption



Today, we will continue with our discussion on Spiritual Adoption. For review: Spiritual Adoption must be *YHWH* ordained. If it isn't ordained by *YHWH*, the relationship may result in heartache and disaster.

The three levels of spiritual adoption are:

- Basic - Helping people with specific needs or tasks
- Brother/Sister/Aunt/Uncle-type relationships, becoming family
- Spiritual Parenting

All three levels are important in the life of a community. The basic level will aid in meeting the physical needs

of people. Those with the gifts of giving and helps will work effectively in these areas. Here are some practical, simple ideas: People with hobbies, such as crocheting or woodworking, can teach these skills to those who never had an opportunity to find joy in creating. Those with financial expertise are able to help in setting up budgets. Those with computer or mechanical skills can help in those specific areas.

In the Second level, long-term relationships begin to develop. A relationship may begin with a common interest. Working alongside one another towards a common goal can develop into long-term bonds. Giving and receiving and accountability in one's life can begin in this stage.

It is in a growing, maturing community that the Gifts and the Fruit of the Spirit are able to flourish. Wounded and immature people begin to learn joy through relationships. They will be able to learn by the example of those more mature than they. The strength to overcome fear bonds will develop as trust grows.

Throughout all of community life, people in the Elder Stage of Maturity are the "parents" and maintain the identity of the family. They are the shepherds who lead the flock to the right paths, to the streams of living water. This will mean sacrifice and dependence upon the *Ruach HaKodesh* (Set Apart Spirit), not our own understanding.

YHWH gives us life so we can then give to others—to the widow, the orphans and strangers in our midst. Who are these widows, orphans and strangers? Much in today's American

Shabbat who come from over an hour way but have no Messianic study groups in their areas. We are looking for ways to encourage them and help launch them in their own areas, even as much as we enjoy having them with us!

On Friday, Barb, Janell and Marilyn will be visiting an area study group that has been looking at the Hebraic Roots of our faith and is now wondering what comes next. We are looking forward to the opportunity to share what we have learned and offer encouragement to these people who have shown themselves to be approved by the study of the Word. Remember us in your prayers as the *Ruach*/Holy Spirit leads you please!

culture has contributed to isolation and family struggles. Some of those issues are:

- Divorce--one-parent families
- Independence is admired and encouraged
- Age-divided groups
- Isolation of singles and seniors in communities
- Fear Bonds
- Abusive History

Instead of the elderly growing into their roles as community parents, they are "put out to pasture," either by choice or not. Many adults reach the later stages of life burned out from stress by attempting to be successful according to the world's standards. Age is looked at as a disease, not with respect for the wisdom and knowledge gained throughout a long life. The expertise and knowledge that people have gained throughout their lives may be looked at as out of date. As a result, few are prepared to be spiritual parents for the third level of Spiritual Adoption.

To be able to become a **Spiritual Parent**, one must have successfully raised their own children to adulthood. Being an Elder is much more demanding than being a parent. Unless, one has first mastered parenthood, one will not be prepared for the sacrificial giving that will take place as an elder in a community.

Spiritual Parenting is not just a part we play or an office given—it is relationship! It is not merely a way to bring healing to the broken. Success is not guaranteed in this process. There will be pain. It is more than just soothing the pain. Just as in

Searching for Identity

Frequently we are asked "What church do you belong to?" Our usual answer: "We do not belong to any church or denomination."

Then people usually ask: "What do you call yourselves?" Most of the time we answer: "We are Messianic Believers." This answer is sometimes misunderstood. Even when the words are understood, it is often not satisfying to those who ask, because they do not really know what it means.

People love understandable labels because, once they have labeled you, they can put you in to a box (in their mind) where they hold their own special beliefs about your religion. Whether or not those beliefs are correct is usually not an issue for them, as long as they have that "box" in which to place you. Such an attitude can lead to religious prejudice, because the "box" in which they have placed you may contain misunderstandings about your true beliefs. The history books are full of persecutions, and even wars, which have been fought in the name of religion, many of them because people believed something about their "enemy" which was not true. (Today is no exception.)

Several years ago we received e-mails from a man who always closed them with the phrase, "Labels are for soup cans." We fully concur with his sentiment, however, to give an answer such as that simply would not satisfy the average person who is accustomed to putting religious labels on people in an attempt to understand what they believe.

Sometimes people will ask: " Are you Jewish?".....

After being asked if we are Jewish, usually the next question is: "Are you Christian?"....

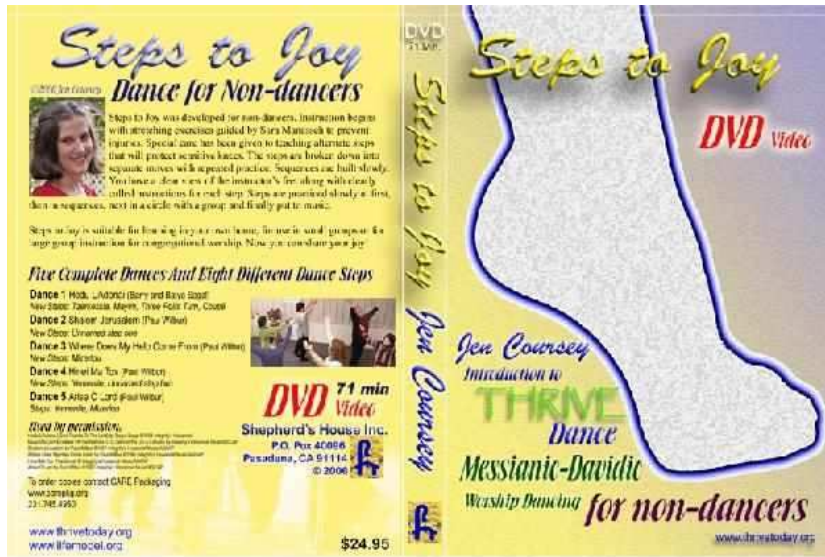
Keeping Your Joy Full!

parenting children, there are no set rules (except walking in Torah, of course!) or programs. There is no time limit. There will be struggles, heartache and frustration.

As a spiritual parent, be prepared to discover the gaps in your own maturity. You will continue to grow and mature throughout this process as well. There will be times when you wonder if you can or should continue as your own immaturity comes to the surface.

The spiritual parent must have good boundaries in place. Your "child" may become angry at times with those boundaries, because they have not learned what it means to have boundaries. It is up to the spiritual parent to remain resolved and confident in the boundaries they have set in place. You will have to remind yourself that this is for the growth of your "child." Being a spiritual parent, does not mean treating the adoptee as a little child. They are adults and should be treated as such. The goal is interdependent relationships, not dependency.

Then one day, you begin to see a little fruit for your labors. Your "spiritual child" will make a good choice and you will celebrate. The day arrives when your "child" ministers to others or even you. This is an important step forward in maturity. The "child" begins to think about the needs of others, moving toward adulthood. They may begin to see the self-centeredness in which they have been walking. These small steps may take months or years, depending upon the extent of the trauma these "children" have experienced. You will need every ounce of patience and perseverance



that *YHWH Elohim* has taught you throughout the years. You will need to be strengthened by prayer and your "brothers and sisters."

This may all sound discouraging--"How is anyone able to be a Spiritual Parent?" It is only through the power and authority given to us in *Yahshua* our Messiah. As we willingly submit to His authority in our lives along with the pruning and discipline, we will mature into the plan He has set in place for our individual lives and communities.

Our friends at CARE have developed a wonderful teaching tool in cooperation with Shepherd's House Ministries. This DVD, narrated by Jen Coursey, with warm up exercises by Sarah Manassah, whom we have also met, provides instruction and encouragement for non dancers to be able to dance as part of their worship of our Messiah! Yes, five dances, with step by step instructions given with the music, after several slower practices. Thank you Jen and company, for your work to help even those who may have physical disabilities that make it hard for them to dance by providing alternate steps for those who need them!
